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Adverbs and Adverbial Phrases



Types of Adverbs

An **adverb** is a word that modifies a verb, an adjective or an adverb. It usually tells us how, where, when, why, to what extent, how often, and on what condition something occurs.

- She walked **quickly** to the car.
- The talk was **extremely** interesting.
- The programme went **well**.

Adverb of manner	He sings melodiously .
Adverb of place	She has lived there for ten years.
Adverb of time	My school reopened yesterday .
Adverb of frequency	They often visit their grandparents in the summer.
