

Types of Adverbs

An adverb is a word that modifies a verb, an adjective or an adverb. It usually tells us how, where, when, why, to what extent, how often, and on what condition something occurs.

- She walked quickly to the car.
- · The talk was extremely interesting.
- · The programme went well.

Study this table to revise the kinds of adverbs.

Adverb of manner	He sings melodiously.
Adverb of place	She has lived there for ten years.
Adverb of time	My school reopened yesterday.
Adverb of frequency	They often visit their grandparents in the summer.
Adverb of reason	We were late and, therefore, missed you.
Adverb of degree	The project is nearly done.
