Summary of the poem:-

The poet sensitizes the reader that the tree is also like a human being. It gradually grows. It is rooted in the soil and it takes sunlight, air and water to grow. So just a cut from the knife cannot kill the tree because the part where the tree is cut just gives the sap as the human bleeds when hurt. The wound of the tree will heal with the passage of time and again new leaves and branches will grow there. So if the tree has to be killed permanently then it has to be uprooted from the soil. It just withers and dries up with the action of sun and wind. Then the trunk will become brown, twist and will harden.. Finally the tree will die.

Answer these questions.

Q1)How does the tree heal itself?

Ans:-Nature gifts every tree with a healing touch that doesnt allows it to die.The tree heals itself with the passage of time,and the part where the tree is cut gives the SAP and then new leaves and new branches grow from the same part.

Q2)what, according to the speaker, will finally kill the tree?
